

Recommendation

6th Grade Teams

Recommendation: The 6th grade is looking to transition to two teams each made up of four teachers: an English teacher, a mathematics teacher, a science teacher, and a social studies teacher (special education teacher would be embedded on the team) to enhance the following:

Key Objectives:

- Transition from elementary to middle school
- Build positive bonds between students and teachers (Academic Extension)
- Improve subject-based teaching structure
- Enhance Team-based communication

Current Structure: The 6th grade has four teams each made up of two teachers: English/social studies teacher and math/science teacher (special education teacher is across two teams)



6th Grade Teams

Four person teams

- Extend the middle school model of two four-person teams to the 6th grade that is currently established in the 7th and 8th grade.
- Maintain the unique 6th grade academic extension block
- Students will travel as a unit from class to class through the core subjects
- Facilitates enhanced transition to 7th and 8th grade

Teacher schedule

- Teachers will teach four periods within their subject area and one period of Academic Extension
 - AE will continue to serve as a focused enrichment and support period
 - Four classrooms are either connected or across the hall on each team
- Curriculum and Instruction
 - Enhanced curriculum alignment across the grade, as well as vertical alignment
 - Increased collaboration at department meetings
 - Enhanced instruction (cross curricular projects, inquiry-based learning, student-focused learning)



Common Planning

- Teacher Teams: Academic teaming organizes teachers across subjects so that teacher teams share responsibility for curriculum, instruction, evaluation, and student supports for the same group of approximately 80 students
- Each team has common planning time every other day for teachers to communicate and facilitate supports for students they teach in common and the integration of curriculum across disciplines
 - Five teachers review student needs and supports
 - Enhanced communication w/ special education teacher to support students on IEPs
 - Increase collaboration (5 teachers planning, scheduling and assessing curriculum and learning projects)
 - Communication platform (Schoology) aligned across all team teachers

Transition

Transition from Elementary to NMS

- Admin. and Counselors visit the elementary schools (5th grade)(March)
 - Review 6th grade teams, extra-curricular activities, school events, classes, lunch, etc.
 - Student ambassadors Q&A
- Incoming 6th Grade Parent Information Night (March)
 - Review course offerings, middle school programs, the course selection process, extracurricular activities, meet with the middle school counsel
 - department, PTO, and administration
 - Introduction to the middle school transition, and how we will support each child's success

Transition

Transition from Elementary to NMS

- Step-up Day (June of 5th grade)
 - Students are placed on their teams for next year to help students connect with their teachers, peers and new teams to assist in children feeling more comfortable and confident in a new environment
 - Team-building activities, tour the school, learn about the resources, clubs and activities
 - Students receive team t-shirts
- Student schedules are sent home on the last day of school
- August Open House (6th Grade)
 - Receive a duplicate student schedule, locker assignment, tours of the building (from 8th grade ambassadors), information about NMS teams, teacher
 - websites, extra-curricular activities available to students, etc. Parents will also be able to meet with school counselors, PTO and NMS administration

6th Grade Classes that Support the Transition to NMS

iPad/Library Class

- All 6th grade students have this exploratory class first quarter
- Students will learn how to use the iPad as an educational tool

• Students will be provided with an overview of the structure and

resources of the NMS Library

Social/Health Guidance Class

- 6th grade students will have this exploratory class second quarter
- Students will apply their iPad instruction, and learn to use technology to support executive functioning and study skills, as well as how to be safe and positive digital citizens online
- Students will learn developmentally appropriate skills to enhance their academic, social and emotional well-being and development

Social/Emotional Benefits of Four Person Teams

- Students have more opportunities to meet and connect with students and teachers
- Students benefit from exposure to and understanding of different teaching styles
- Four person teams align with the transition from grade 6 to 7 and 7 to 8
- Four person teams will allow better alignment with an overall middle school model and with our NMS school schedule. This promotes a schoolwide sense of community

Academic Extension- What it is?

"The Academic Extension course fosters growth and development through an extension of the content covered in class while providing additional academic, team building and interpersonal skill. At the beginning of the school year, this course will focus on an introduction to the general procedures and expectations as well as activities that will assist students in acclimating to the middle school environment. As the year progresses, the course will focus on specific academic content and group-based activities. This course will also be a time for students to receive extra help, practice content skills, extend learning of the content, take assessments, complete make-up work, and conference with teachers. While students will not receive a grade for the Academic Extension class, much of the work completed during this period will be tied to their academic class grades."

Academic Extension is a Way of Supporting Students as they Transition to a Team of Four Teachers:
