What is the Next-Generation MCAS?

- ☐ Updated version of the nearly 20-year-old MCAS assessment
- Thinking abilities, application of knowledge, and ability to make connections between reading and writing
- ☐ Gives a clearer signal of readiness for the next grade level or college and career

- Designed to be given on a computer
- ☐ First given in spring 2017 in grades 3-8 in English language arts and math
- Will replace all older ("legacy") MCAS tests in grades 3-10 by 2019

Next-generation MCAS Achievement Levels

Exceeding Expectations

A student who performed at this level exceeded grade-level expectations by demonstrating mastery of the subject matter.

Meeting Expectations


A student who performed at this level met grade-level expectations and is academically on track to succeed in the current grade in this subject.

Partially Meeting Expectations

A student who performed at this level partially met grade-level expectations in this subject.

Not Meeting Expectations

A student who performed at this level did not meet grade-level expectations in this subject.

Scoring Descriptor Changes


- In general, the new standards for Meeting Expectations are more rigorous than the standards for reaching the Proficient level on the legacy MCAS.
- ★ Spring 2017 was the **baseline year** for the new test in grades 3-8.

Statewide 2018 Grades 3-8 ELA Achievement




Approximately 50% of students in the state scored at the Meeting Expectations or above level, with the exception of grade 7 at 46%.


Statewide 2018 Grades 3-8 Math Achievement




Three grades (4, 6, and 7) showed a slight decline in percentage of students scoring Meeting Expectations or above, grade 5 was flat, and grades 3 and 8 showed slight increases over the 2017 scores.




Elementary Math Results










Cole and Vinal Grades 3-5 Math









































Comparison Districts Grades 3-8 Cumulative ELA




Comparison Districts Grades 3-8 Cumulative Math




Grade Cohort Comparisons




High School ELA, Math & Science




Comparison Districts Grade 10 ELA




Comparison Districts Grade 10 Math





Grades 5, 8, 10 Science

2018 Accountability Overview



What is it?

An **accountability system** is the set of policies and practices that a **state** uses to measure and hold schools and districts responsible for raising student achievement for all students, and to prompt and support improvement where necessary.

Massachusetts' current accountability system has been in place since 2012 and is changing due to new federal requirements under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

Why is it important?

 Every school is responsible for the performance of all students.

Identifies areas for improvement

 Every school is rated based on <u>specific</u> <u>indicators</u>.

What are the indicators?

Indicator	Measures
Achievement	ELA, math, & science achievement
Student Growth	ELA/Math Student Growth Percentile (SGP)
High School Completion	 Four-year cohort graduation rate Extended engagement rate Annual dropout rate
English Language Proficiency	Progress made by students towards attaining English language proficiency
Additional Indicators	 Chronic absenteeism Percentage of students completing advanced coursework
Participation	Required by all students, all subgroups, all subjects

Two major components of accountability

Every school receives two ratings

How do we compare to others?

- Percentiles -
- 54th percentile statewide


How do we compare to ourselves?

- Progress toward targets
- Partially Meeting

- All indicators are considered.
- All indicators are weighted.
- All students are considered and weighted for all indicators.
- All student subgroups are considered and weighted for all indicators.
 - High needs, students with disabilities, economically disadvantaged, English language learners, lowest 25%
