Overview

ACCOUNTABILITY

An accountability system is the set of policies and practices that a state uses to measure and hold schools and districts responsible for raising student achievement for all students.

- Academic achievement measures
- ☐ Academic growth measures
- ☐ High School completion rate
- English language learner progress
- ☐ Attendance/Absenteeism
- Advanced coursework

MCAS

An statewide assessment that focuses on students' critical thinking abilities, application of knowledge, and ability to make connections between reading and writing.

- Grades 3-8, 10 ELA, Math, Science
- Computer-based
- Redesigned to reflect new curriculum standards and rigor
- Scoring recalibration
- ☐ A subset of Accountability

- All students are considered and weighted for all indicators.
- All student subgroups are considered and weighted for all indicators.
 - High needs, students with disabilities, economically disadvantaged, English language learners, lowest 25%

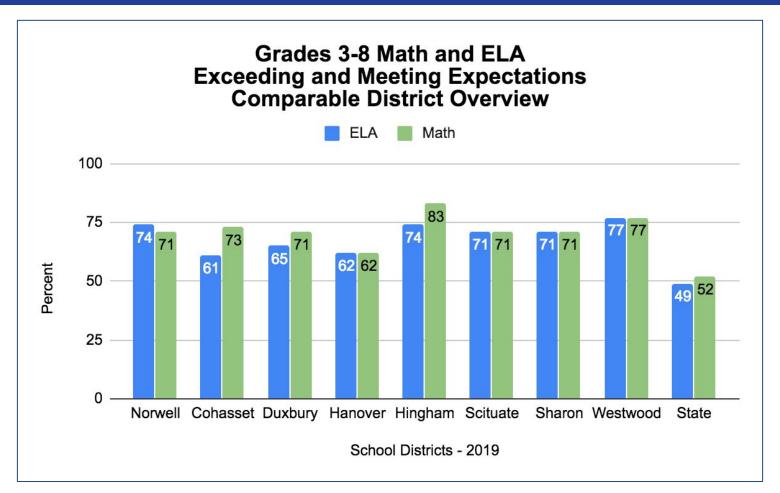


Grades 3-8 Cohort Trend

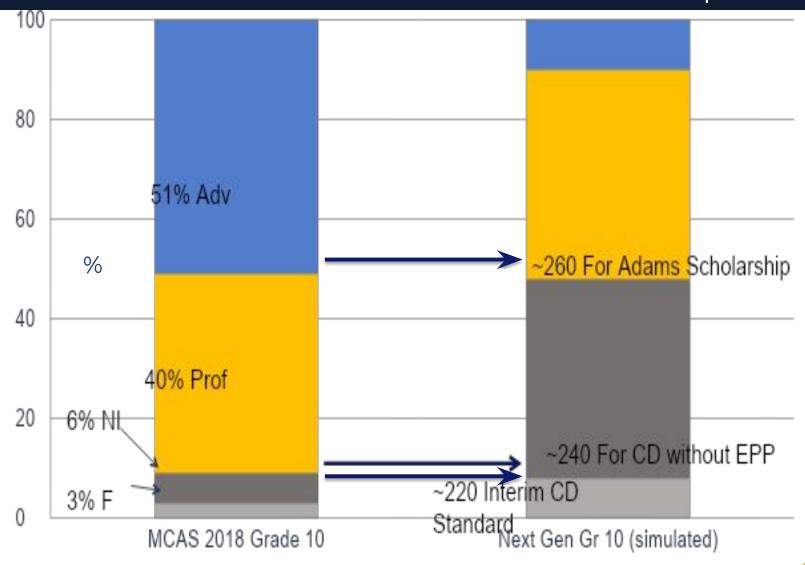

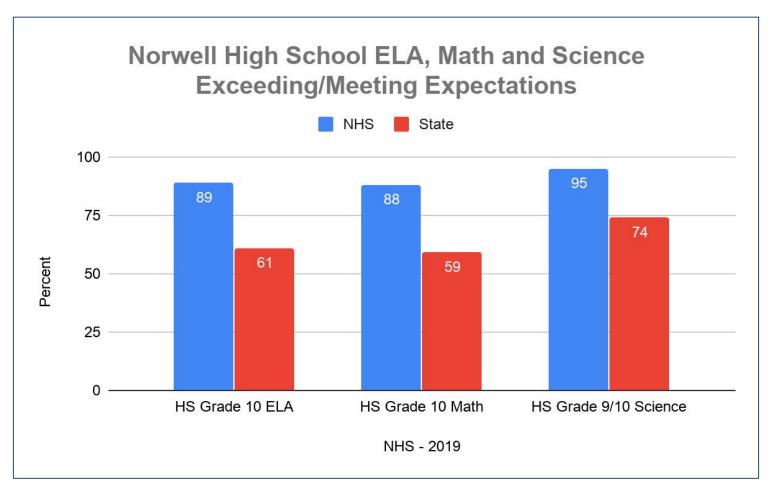


Equipercentile linking model for establishing the interim CD standards for the Classes of 2021 & 2022 (ELA example)

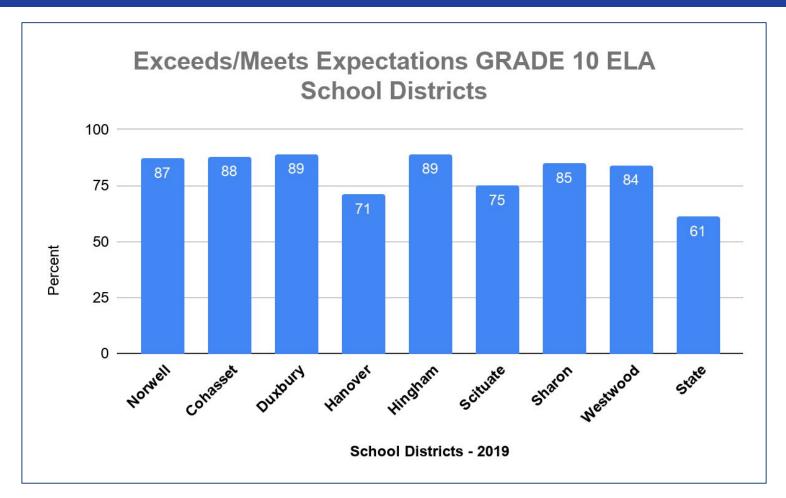

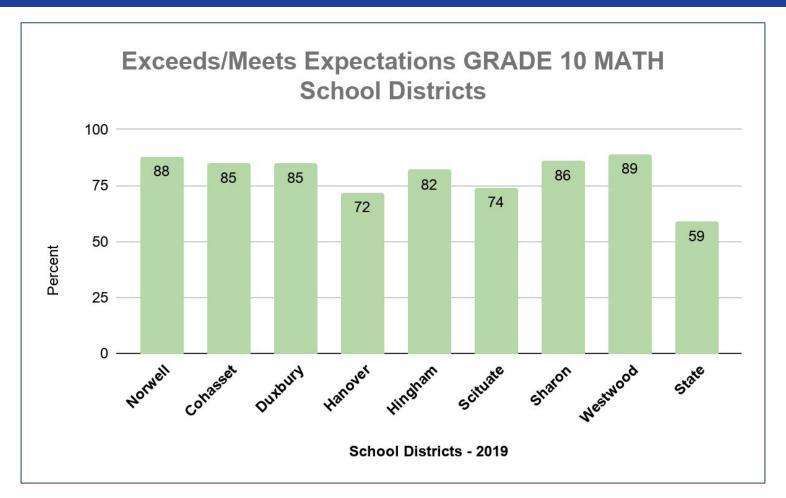


District Comparison - ELA



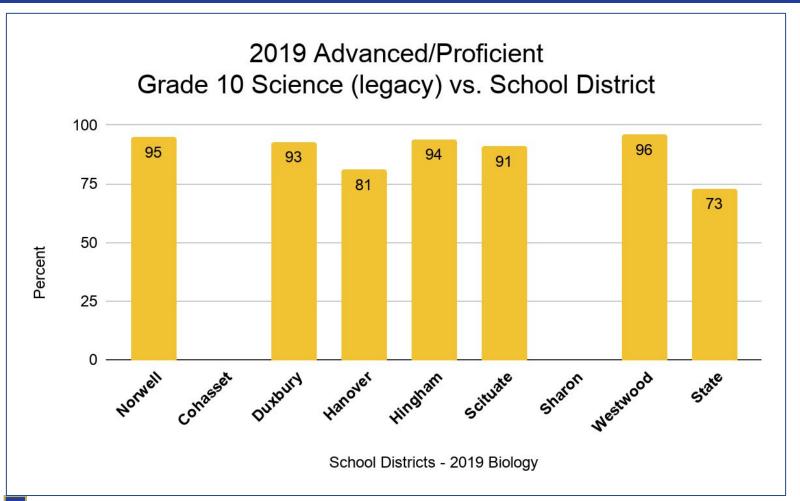


District Comparison - Math
